

## Nomination Process for the 2011-2012 Advisory Committee

If you would like to make a nomination, please contact the nominee and inform them of the nomination. We encourage you to coordinate your nominations with other individuals and organizations in your area of expertise to ensure that the selected nominee will adequately represent your interests.

If you are interested in serving on the Advisory Committee, we encourage you to seek nominations from other organizations and submit an application of your own. All applications will be due no later than November 12, 2010, and should be one to two pages. In your application, please identify which position(s) on the Advisory Committee you are seeking to fill. Applications will be chosen based on the following criteria:

1. Knowledge of alternative fuels, vehicles, technologies, and infrastructure or other related activities (e.g., economic development, financial investment, workforce development and training, sustainability issues, standards and certification, public education and outreach, environmental impacts and market/technology analysis).
2. Ability to adequately represent a designated group, organization or interest.
3. Availability to attend meetings, review documents, and provide feedback in a timely manner.
4. Prior involvement with previous Investment Plan proceedings.
5. Number and significance of nominations.

The Energy Commission is seeking nominees to represent specified slots on the next Advisory Committee. There will be up to 20 members on the Advisory Committee, including representatives from alternative fuel and vehicle industry groups, labor organizations, environmental organizations, community-based justice and public health organizations, recreational boaters, consumer advocates, academic institutions, workforce training groups, private industry, and members-at-large. The Energy Commission will use a nomination process to select members to fill these positions. The Advisory Committee will also include four state agencies: the Natural Resources Agency; the Business, Transportation and Housing Agency; the Labor and Workforce Development Agency; and the California Environmental Protection Agency. As was the case last year, most Advisory Committee members will not be eligible to apply for Program funding. (See "Advisory Committee Roles and Responsibilities" for more details.)
