Purpose

The *2010 IEPR Update* noted that California will need an extensive and well-trained workforce to step into the jobs being created by expansion of the state's clean energy economy. Research conducted under the Energy Commission's Public Interest Energy Research Program indicates the need for a national center consisting of four to six

regional hubs that will provide research, policy and other assistance to build the clean energy workforce of the future. Workforce development specialists nationwide have expressed support for California to take a leadership role in forming this center. The Energy Commission therefore proposes to take the lead in establishing a National Center that will strengthen the capacity of all states to build a clean energy economy focused on renewable energy, energy efficiency, and clean transportation fuels and vehicles.

The goal for the National Center workshop is to gather input from clean energy and workforce stakeholders on the feasibility of the center and its functions and structure. The workshop will bring together all stakeholders interested in providing input for the center's establishment, funding, governance and operation. Regional and national partners will be in attendance to provide their perspective on the need for the center.

Background

To investigate the feasibility of creating the National Center, the Energy Commission commissioned a study by the University of California at Berkeley Labor Center that included interviews with clean energy and workforce experts nationwide. The concept for the National Center is based on the input and advice from this broad range of stakeholders from the public, private, non-profit, education and labor sectors.

Through a combination of strategic research, communications, technical assistance, and policy analysis, the proposed National Center will meet the needs of utilities, clean energy businesses, non-governmental organizations, policymakers, and the workforce development community. Its primary goal will be to build the capacity of states to grow the clean energy economy, and develop and train a workforce that is well prepared to meet industry needs.
