Purpose

In an effort to increase transparency and accountability, this meeting will open a dialog to refresh and update the *California Clean Energy Future* to reflect Governor Brown's 2020 energy policy goals as well as the recently enacted 33 percent renewable portfolio standard. California's state energy and environmental agencies (California Energy Commission, California Environmental Protection Agency, California Air Resources Board, and the California Public Utilities Commission) and the California Independent System Operator Corporation (California ISO) are working together to coordinate and align their proceedings and initiatives to achieve the state's energy and environmental policies. The agencies are looking for feedback on how to measure progress in meeting the policies identified in the *California Clean Energy Future Overview* document and on how to execute the policies and track progress in a transparent and effective way.

Background

The state energy and environmental agencies partnered with the California ISO to develop the *California Clean Energy Future*, which seeks to identify and align the key initiatives needed to achieve the state's far-reaching environmental and energy policy goals. These initiatives are essential to achieving substantial increases in energy efficiency, demand response, and renewable resources in the provision of energy services, as well as the electrification of the transportation sector. The success of these efforts, in turn, hinges on the ability of the state to effectively increase investment of transmission infrastructure, expand the deployment of smart grid technologies, and drive technological innovation. An *Overview* document, *Implementation Plan*, and *Inter-Agency Road Map* were first released in September, 2010 and are available at: [www.cacleanenergyfuture.org/]. This meeting focuses on two matters: (1) updating the *California Clean Energy Future Overview* to better reflect the goals of Governor Brown's energy vision and of SB x1 2 (Simitian, Chapter 1, Statutes of 2011-12 First Extraordinary Session), and (2) considering whether the agencies have identified the appropriate proposed metrics for measuring progress on the initiatives essential to meeting California's goals. The *California Clean Energy Future* provides a basis for understanding the interactions and dependencies across the agencies tasked with implementing those policies and programs that is central to achieving the state's long-term energy goals as well as related environmental and economic goals.
