Purpose

The California Energy Commission staff has prepared a draft version of the *Benefits Report for the ARFVT Program*. The draft report will be available at the website above. The Energy Commission is seeking input from the Advisory Committee, stakeholders, and the public regarding the evaluation of benefits from the program.

Background

Assembly Bill 118 (Nuñez, Chapter 750, Statutes of 2007) created the ARFVT Program, to be administered by the Energy Commission. This authorizes the Energy Commission to develop and deploy alternative and renewable fuels and advanced transportation technologies to help meet the state's climate change policies. The ARFVT Program statutes were amended by Assembly Bill 109 (Nuñez, Chapter 313, Statutes of 2008), requiring the Energy Commission to prepare an evaluation of the ARFVT Program every two years as part of the biennial *Integrated Energy Policy Report* (IEPR). The *Benefits Report for the ARFVT Program* is the first evaluation.

The Energy Commission is also required to create an Advisory Committee to provide input regarding the ARFVT Program. The Advisory Committee is composed of representatives of fuel and vehicle technology consortia, labor organizations, environmental organizations, community-based justice and public health organizations, recreational boaters, consumer advocates, academic institutions, workforce training groups, and private industry. The Advisory Committee also includes representatives from various state agencies: the Natural Resources Agency; the Business, Transportation and Housing Agency; the Labor and Workforce Development Agency; the Department of General Services; and the California Environmental Protection Agency.
