The California Desert Renewable Energy Conservation Plan (DRECP) was established by Governor Schwarzenegger's Executive Order S-14-08, which identifies targets for increasing California's renewable energy portfolio. The DRECP, when completed, is expected to further these objectives and accelerate the processing of renewable projects in the California desert (Mojave and Colorado Deserts). The DRECP is a Natural Community Conservation Plan (NCCP), which will help provide for effective protection and conservation of desert ecosystems while allowing for the appropriate development of renewable energy projects. It will provide long-term endangered species permit assurances to renewable energy developers and provide a process for conservation funding to implement the DRECP. It will also serve as the basis for one or more Habitat Conservation Plans (HCP) under the Federal Endangered Species Act.

The Stakeholder Committee was established to advise the state and federal agencies on the development of the DRECP and to provide a forum for public participation and input. The list of stakeholders is posted on the website and in summary represents the interests of the counties in the desert region, renewable energy developers, environmental organizations, electric utilities, and state and federal agencies.
