LOCALIZED HEALTH IMPACTS REPORT
for
Selected Projects Awarded Funding Through the
Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology
Program Under Solicitation PON-13-606
Publication CEC-600-2014-002-AD2**

The *Localized Health Impacts Report for Selected Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Projects Awarded Funding Through the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program under Solicitation PON-13-606* was posted April 11, 2014, and the 30-day public comment period ended May 12, 2013. An addendum to this report was posted on June 19, 2014, and the 30-day public comment period ended July 19, 2014.

On July 3, 2014, the California Energy Commission posted a Revised Notice of Proposed Awards resulting in an additional project proposed for funding under the Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure grant solicitation PON-13-606. The Energy Commission is required under California Code of Regulations, Title 13, Chapter 8.1, Section 2343(c)(6), to consider the localized health impacts and environmental justice when approving projects for funding.

The Energy Commission has published a second addendum to the original Localized Health Impacts Report that analyzes the additional project proposed for funding under the Program. This addendum was publicly available on July 16, 2014.

The specific projects analyzed in this report are:

- County of Sonoma, General Services Department's *Sustaining and Growing the Redwood Coast Electric Trail*
- Mendocino Land Trust, Incorporated's *Bringing Electric Vehicle Charging Stations to Mendocino County California State Parks*
- Sacramento Area Council of Governments' *Sacramento Regional TakeCharge Plan Implementation: Grocery Store Fast Charge Pilot*
- Woodland Joint Unified School District's *Electric Vehicle Charging Installations*

- Corridor Power, Incorporated's *Fast-Charging Plaza Project*
- County of Los Angeles' *Electric Vehicle Charging at County of Los Angeles South Vermont Street Location*

The second addendum to the report includes a description of the project, demographic data for the area where the project will be located, and an analysis of the impacts of this project in communities with the most significant exposure to air contaminants or localized air contaminants.
