Notice of Fifth Addendum to the LOCALIZED HEALTH IMPACTS REPORT

Selected Projects Awarded Funding Through the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program under Solicitation PON-11-602 Publication CEC-600-2014-008-AD5

The *Localized Health Impacts Report for Selected Alternative Fuels Infrastructure Projects Awarded Funding Through the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program under Solicitation PON-11-602* was posted on April 27, 2012, and the 30-day public comment period ended June 1, 2012.

The Energy Commission published four addendums to the original Localized Health Impacts Report that analyzed additional projects recommended for funding under the Round 2 - Notice of Proposed Awards (NOPA) and station location changes proposed for funding under the Revised Round 2 - NOPA. These addendums were posted as follows:

- Addendum 1 was posted on September 21, 2012 and the 30-day public comment period ended October 31, 2012.
- Addendum 2 was posted on November 29, 2012 and the 30-day public comment period ended December 31, 2012.
- Addendum 3 was posted on March 22, 2013 and the 30-day public comment period ended on April 22, 2013.
- Addendum 4 was posted on April 23, 2013 and the 30-day public comment period ended May 24, 2013.

This addendum addresses a station location change for RTC Fuels, LLC dba Pearson Fuels, project "19 Pearson Fuels E85 Stations." The original E85 station location was 376 Castro Street, San Francisco, CA 94114 and the new station location will be at 2831 Cesar Chavez Street, San Francisco, CA 94110. Addendum 5 contains a project description that includes impacts, benefits, outreach efforts, and a discussion of the potential health impacts related to air pollutants explicitly identified in the project.

The addendum to the Localized Health Impacts Report was publicly available on August 29, 2014. The Energy Commission is required under California Code of Regulations, Title 13, Chapter 8.1, Section 2343(c)(6), to consider the localized health impacts and environmental justice when approving projects for funding.
