Notice of Eighth Addendum to the LOCALIZED HEALTH IMPACTS REPORT

Selected Projects Awarded Funding Through the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program under Solicitation PON-11-602 Publication CEC-600-2014-008-AD8

The Energy Commission is required under California Code of Regulations, Title 13, Chapter 8.1, Section 2343(c)(6), to consider the localized health impacts and environmental justice when approving projects for funding.

The *Localized Health Impacts Report for Selected Alternative Fuels Infrastructure Projects Awarded Funding Through the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program under Solicitation PON-11-602* was posted on April 27, 2012, and the 30-day public comment period ended June 1, 2012.

The Energy Commission published seven addendums to the original Localized Health Impacts Report that analyzed additional projects recommended for funding under the Round 2 - Notice of Proposed Awards (NOPA) and station location changes proposed for funding under the Revised Round 2 - NOPA. These addendums were posted as follows:

- Addendum 1 was posted on September 21, 2012 and the 30-day public comment period ended October 31, 2012.
- Addendum 2 was posted on November 29, 2012 and the 30-day public comment period ended December 31, 2012.
- Addendum 3 was posted on March 22, 2013 and the 30-day public comment period ended April 22, 2013.
- Addendum 4 was posted on April 23, 2013 and the 30-day public comment period ended May 24, 2013.
- Addendum 5 was posted on August 29, 2014 and the 30-day public comment period ended September 28, 2014.
- Addendum 6 was posted on September 17, 2014 and the 30-day public comment period ended October 17, 2014

- Addendum 7 was posted on December 4, 2014 and the 30-day public comment period ended January 3, 2015.

The Energy Commission has published an eighth addendum to the original Localized Health Impacts Report that analyzes a new location and community impacts of a project proposed for funding under the Program. Whole Energy Pacifica LLC project “*Inline Biodiesel Blending Terminal*” has changed location of the project from 810 Wright Avenue, Richmond, California 94804 to 860 West Beach Street, Watsonville, California 95076. The addendum was publicly available on February 12, 2015.

The addendum to the report includes staff application of the Environmental Justice Screening Method (EJSM) to identify projects located in areas with social vulnerability indicators and the greatest exposure to air pollution and associated health risks.
