Background

Assembly Bill 118 (Núñez, Chapter 750, Statutes of 2007), created the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology (ARFVT) Program. The statute, subsequently amended by AB 109 (Núñez, Chapter 313, Statutes of 2008), and AB 8 (Perea, Chapter 401, Statutes of 2013) authorizes the Energy Commission to develop and deploy alternative and renewable fuels and advanced transportation technologies to help attain the state's climate change policies.

The purpose of the NGVIP is to provide incentives to reduce the purchase price of new on-road natural gas vehicles, which will directly benefit California's economy and the environment by expanding the use of a domestically produced non-petroleum fuel that is a low-cost alternative to gasoline and diesel and has lower carbon emission characteristics. Incentive reservations will be accepted starting July 31, 2015. The incentives are available on a first-come, first-served basis and at varying levels depending on the gross vehicle weight.
