Scope of Work

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to co-sponsor the 2016 POWER Conference on Energy Research and Policy, scheduled in Berkeley, California on March 18, 2016.

The 2016 POWER Conference will be the 21st annual conference focusing on electricity markets and systems. It brings together researchers from around the nation and some foreign countries to present the results of their studies of electricity markets. The purpose is to bring together outstanding scholars and practitioners from around the world to exchange ideas and research results on topics related to electricity markets and regulation.

The co-sponsorship affords the Energy Commission recognition as a supporter of this valuable conference and demonstrates California's leadership in developing an electricity market in which preferred resources play a prominent role and environmental stewardship is paramount.

The Contractor shall:

- Conduct an Annual Research Conference on electricity markets, various market designs, and assessments of system operations.
- Gather academic researchers, policy-makers, and industry practitioners for a one-day intensive examination of new research on electricity industry restructuring.
- Facilitate the use and adaptation of project research results to the relevant policy questions of the day
- Acknowledge Energy Commission co-sponsorship in conference materials.
- Allow five (5) Energy Commission staff to attend without paying the customary registration fee.
- Disseminate conference results through a set of proceedings and a series of public forums that will engage policy makers and industry participants in critical, careful, public debate of the application of the results to important, contemporary issues
