<u>SITING DIVISION</u>		
Electric Generation Systems Program Specialist (All Levels)	5,6,8	<p>This position, EGSPS I, is currently used in other Divisions, but is new to the Siting Division. I have included "All Levels" to ensure that higher classification levels are included should individuals working as EGSPS I be promoted.</p> <p>The EGSPS I duty statement states that EGSPS I will be a subject-matter expert, and will perform complicated studies and analyses of electricity generation technologies, electric system and policy implementation requirements, and evaluations of transmission and distribution system development opportunities. Duties will include advising Commissioners and legislative bodies on the results of engineering economics and cost-benefit studies, and the performance and cost effectiveness analyses of electricity systems. Because the EGSPS I will provide advice directly to decision makers, these duties involve participation in the making of decisions which may foreseeably have a material financial effect on an economic interest. The type of economic interest that could be effected would be the creators of specific electricity generation technologies and those entities with an interest in developing electricity transmission and distribution systems.</p>

Energy Resources Specialist III (Supervisory)	2,4,7	Reclassification of Energy Commission Supervisor II positions. The ECS II classification will no longer be used in this division.

Electric Generation Systems Specialist (All Levels)	2,4,7	Reclassification of certain Energy Commission Supervisor III positions to EGSS I. Promotional opportunity exists within the classification, so "All Levels" uses to cover future EGSS II or III. Some ECS III positions remain in the division, so not deleting at this time.

This includes use of leads submitted to the Energy Commission by third parties, field work, laboratory testing, use of the market survey results generated by the Energy Commission's outside consultant(s), and internal development of leads.</p> <p>Category 2 included: lead project and contract management for the Energy Commission's contract with CSU Sacramento Engineering Energy Efficiency Test Lab.</p>
