Scope of Work

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to fund the Energy Commission's membership as a Founding and Champion Member of Veloz, a California nonprofit organization.

BACKGROUND:

Veloz is a California-based nonprofit organization, founded by industry veterans to bring public and private sectors together to advance the electric car market. It builds off of the momentum generated by the successful California Plug-in Electric Vehicle Collaborative, which was a multi-stakeholder, public-private effort working to ensure a strong and enduring transition to a plug-in electric vehicle market in California. Like the Collaborative, Veloz brings together elected and appointed officials, automakers, utilities, infrastructure providers, environmental organizations and others. However, Veloz is taking this effort further with a creative, multi-media campaign to promote the virtues of driving electric cars.

As a member of Veloz, the Energy Commission will be part of forward-thinking discussions to raise public awareness and promote the benefits of driving electric cars. Electrification of the transportation sector, which accounts for nearly 40 percent of statewide greenhouse gas emissions, is a key California strategy to meeting its ambitious climate change policies. Thus, it is critical that the Energy Commission contribute its expertise and energy to this effort. Veloz's mission is consistent with California's energy and environmental policies.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The Energy Commission will pay a membership fee of \$50,000 during FY 2020/2021. The fee provides the Energy Commission membership in Veloz, which includes the following:

- Briefings and input on Veloz's electric car awareness campaign.
- Work with Commission Agreement Manager and Media to prominently display the CEC logo on public facing electric car awareness campaign literature and displays at the Commission's discretion.
- Leadership participation in member meetings, working groups, workshops, webinars, and other events.
- Annual forums to collaborate with stakeholders in the electric car community.
