**Section 3.2**

As part of its work to assist Mexican partners to implement projects in the fields of environmental and resources conservation, climate change mitigation, and sustainable energy, the German International Aid Agency, Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ), organized a Forum on White Certificates workshop, in cooperation with the Mexican Energy Secretary, SENER, and the Mexican Environmental Secretary, SEMARNAT, to explore ways to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. The workshop organizers requested the California Energy Commission to send a representative to participate in the workshop and share California’s strategy for meeting its energy efficiency goals, as well as the possibility of California’s potential involvement in expanding the energy efficiency market into Mexico. As part of the ask, the organizers offered to cover all related costs of travel, including transportation, lodging, and meals.

Additionally, the California Energy Commission’s participation in the Forum on White Certificates workshop will help expand cooperation with Mexico and fulfills the goals and intent of the MOU signed between California and Mexico National Ministry of Energy to cooperate on clean energy – specifically to encourage and promote technical cooperation and activities in the fields of low-carbon energy, clean technologies, and energy efficiency in a manner that incorporates best practices and lessons learned.
