

Solicitation Overview

- Develop and install charging products that schedule electric vehicle (EV) charging (or discharging) in response to grid signals
- Funding from:
 - California Budget Act of 2021-22
 - Clean Transportation Program
- Proposed today:
 - Five projects (out of 10 proposed awards)
 - \$106,695,660 million in CEC funds





Benefit to Californians

- Reduced charging costs and emissions
- Improved grid reliability
- Equipping customers with EV-powered home backup capabilities
