**Re: Will Serve Letter for Treated Wastewater**

Dear Mr. Orth,

The City of Parlier currently owns and operates a wastewater treatment facility with a capacity of 2.0 MGD. The City is in the process of expanding the plant to 4.0 MGD.


KRCD proposes construction of a 565 megawatt Community Power Plant (CPP) adjacent to the wastewater facility at 9664 S. Bethel Avenue in Fresno County.

We understand that KRCD proposes to use treated wastewater from the Parlier WWTP to provide cooling water for the power plant. KRCD will construct and operate a pumping facility to transport water from the WWTP to the CPP. The treated water will be filtered and disinfected by KRCD for use in the cooling system. Backwash water from the treatment system filters will be delivered back to the headwork's of the WWTP.

Please accept this letter as the City of Parlier's commitment to sell KRCD treated wastewater for power plant cooling up to the maximum requirement of the cooling system. The terms of sale will be specified in a water sales agreement between the City of Parlier and the Kings River Conservation District prior to construction of the CPP.

The City of Parlier will be able to deliver treated wastewater continuously to the KRCD power plant. The use of treated wastewater will not result in significant impacts to the City of Parlier WWTP or collection system. Please contact me if you have questions.

**RE: "WILL-SERVE" LETTER FOR TREATED WASTEWATER**

Dear Mr. Orth:

The City of Sanger currently owns and operates a wastewater treatment plant with a capacity of 3.0 MGD, and discharges the plant's effluent to percolation ponds on Lincoln Avenue, south of Sanger. Kings River Conservation District (KRCD) proposes to construct the Community Power Plant (CPP), a 565-megawatt, nominally rated, combined-cycle power plant at 9664 South Bethel Avenue in Fresno County. The estimated date for commercial operation of the power plant is December 2010.

We understand that KRCD proposes to use treated wastewater from the Sanger Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to provide a portion of the power plant's cooling water supply. KRCD would construct and operate a pipeline and pumping facility to transfer the wastewater from the Lincoln Ponds disposal field to the CPP site. The treated wastewater would be filtered and disinfected by KRCD at CPP before being used for cooling.


Please accept this letter as the City of Sanger's possible commitment to sell KRCD treated wastewater at its Lincoln Ponds disposal field for power plant cooling use, at a flow rate of up to 1.5 MGD and an annual average flow rate of 1.1 MGD. The commercial terms of the sale of the treated wastewater will be specified in a water sales agreement between the City of Sanger and KRCD to be executed prior to construction of the power plant and pipeline facilities by KRCD. The water sales agreement must be approved by the City of Sanger City Council in order to deliver treated wastewater to KRCD.

The Sanger WWTP is an extremely reliable plant and we estimate, based on operating history, that treated wastewater will be available continuously to KRCD for use for power plant cooling. KRCD's use of treated wastewater will not result in significant impacts to the City of Sanger's wastewater treatment plant or distribution system.
