Dear Mr. Sorensen,

In October 2007, on behalf of Boulevard Associates, LLC (Boulevard), a subsidiary of NextEra Energy Resources (formerly known as FPL Energy), Tetra Tech EC, Inc (Tetra Tech) sent a letter to serve as notification of Boulevard's proposal to develop a solar thermal power generating facility, and to request information pertaining to biological resources in the area. A response to this letter was received from Therese O'Rourke dated October 25, 2007. Because Boulevard postponed the analysis of biological resources at the Ford Dry Lake project site¹, the purpose of this letter is to provide updated proposed project boundaries and to request updated biological resource information in the area, if applicable.

To comply with federal, state, and local laws, as well as support the conservation efforts of the resource agencies, we are requesting the following information from each agency for the areas of the potential project sites:

1. Species of concern, including Listed Species, Candidate Species, Species of Special Concern, species that are likely to become candidates for listing in the near future, as well as other species that your agency is targeting for special conservation efforts;
2. Special natural communities targeted by your agency for special conservation efforts; and
3. All other biological issues that may be of concern to your agency in the project area.

Based on your response, as well as other information we will gather from other resource agencies, data bases, unpublished reports, management plans, and area experts, we will be developing a list of special resources and protocols for assessing those resources in light of project development. We will submit this to you for your review and approval. We look forward also to discussing these protocols via conference call as soon as we can arrange a time that is suitable for all parties.

¹ The proposed Ford Dry Lake project site is located between Desert Center and Blythe, California, on Bureau of Land Management (BLM) land (see attachments).










**FORD DRY LAKE SOLAR PROJECT



REGIONAL LOCATION MAP**






**FORD DRY LAKE SOLAR PROJECT
