COMMITTEE SCHEDULING ORDER

Background

On June 15, 2009, the California Energy Commission received an Application for Certification (AFC) from Mariposa Energy L.L.C., to construct and operate an electrical generating plant in northeastern Alameda County, California. The proposed Mariposa Energy Project power plant would be a natural-gas fired, simple-cycle peaking facility rated at a gross generating capacity of 200 megawatts (MW). The proposed Mariposa Energy Project would be located approximately seven miles northwest of the City of Tracy, seven miles east of Livermore, six miles south of the community of Byron, and approximately 2.5 miles west of the community of Mountain House (located in San Joaquin County). The proposed project site is in an unincorporated area of northeastern Alameda County designated as Large Parcel Agriculture by the Alameda County East County Area Plan.

Summary

The Energy Commission assigned a Committee of two Commissioners to conduct proceedings on the AFC. The Committee held a Mandatory Status Conference at the Bethany-Byron Irrigation District headquarters near the Community of Byron on October 6, 2010, to discuss the review process and to identify issues that could affect the schedule. The attached Committee Schedule is based on the parties' proposed schedules and related discussions at the Mandatory Status Conference.

The schedule contains a list of events that must occur in order to complete the certification process. This initial schedule covers the period up to the Prehearing Conference with the balance of the schedule to be determined at the Prehearing Conference. The Committee encourages the parties to consider this schedule an outer boundary and make their best efforts to complete the milestones ahead of these dates. Some deadlines are contingent upon reviews to be conducted by federal, state, and local agencies. The Applicant must provide sufficient review time for the responsible agencies to meet the deadlines specified in the schedule.

Based on the discussion during the Status Conference, resolution of technical issues regarding air quality, biological resources, land use, soil and water, transmission systems engineering, and traffic and transportation (aviation) are pending. Resolution of these issues shall be addressed during the data exchange process and in public meetings with the parties and interested governmental agencies. Given the complexities involved in resolving the issues, the parties are on notice that the Committee may modify the schedule at any time upon either its own motion or that of a party. [Cal. Code Regs., tit. 20, § 1709.7(c).]

Status Reports

The schedule requires monthly status reports to be submitted by all parties to determine whether case development is progressing satisfactorily and to bring potential schedule delays or other relevant matters to the Committee's attention. The burden is on the Applicant to produce the necessary data according to the schedule. If there are delays, the Committee may adopt a performance approach resulting in a commensurate slip of the schedule.

To facilitate the process, each party shall serve and file status reports on the first day of each month starting **November 1, 2010**, and continuing until the Supplemental Staff Assessment (SSA) is published. The reports shall be received by the other parties and the Commission's Docket Unit, 1516 9th Street, MS 4, Sacramento, California 95814-5512, **and must be filed no later than 3:00 p.m.** Status reports must contain "Docket No. 09-AFC-3" in the caption or heading. In addition to providing printed copies, the parties shall e-mail their status reports to the Hearing Officer and to those with e-mail addresses as indicated on the Proof-of-Service list.


