Tony Ladoux told me that his organization typically has no problem finding construction workers to fill jobs wherever they may be. I then proceeded to ask him about specific trades by giving him the construction personnel estimates for the project. He indicated that there would not be a problem filling those jobs but that I should probably talk to some of the individual trades union. He gave me the phone numbers for the Boilermakers, Electricians, Millwrights, and Plumber/Pipefitters unions.

I also asked him if he thought that construction workers relocated to job sites with their families and if not what they did for accomodation. He said that since construction work typically for short periods, construction workers do not relocate their families but typically stay in hotel/motels close to the construction site or come with their trailers.

**Subject:** School Enrollment

I called the school district to ask about enrollment by grade last week but was told to try back again this week since the enrollment numbers were not finalized as yet. I called today and left a message for Anna Ramirez, the Pupil-Personnel/Attendant asking her about enrollment numbers. Ms. Ramirez returned my phone call and after explaining what it was I needed and the reason for the data request, she said that she would gather the necessary data and send it to me via fax. She pointed out that the numbers for the current academic year (which starts on August 26, 2002) are still somewhat tentative. The school district serves a predominantly rural farm population. Due to the presence of migrant workers, enrollment fluctuates quite a bit from month to month. The school district has also seen a decline in enrollment over the past 3 years of about 20 students per year.

I received a fax with the enrollment numbers for the school district and since the numbers were not very clear I called Ms. Ramirez. She gave me the enrollment numbers as follows:

Enrollment numbers for the 2003/04 academic year have not yet been projected and are not likely to be available until sometime next year. In place of actual projections from the district, Ms. Ramirez suggested that we assume an additional 3 students per grade for the 2003/04 school year.

**Subject:** Fire Services

Fire Marshall McDaniel called in response to my voicemail message earlier this morning. He told me that the nearest station to the proposed project site is Fire Station No. 2 located at 791 S. Walnut Road in Turlock).

City of Turlock Fire Services is a combination service – it has paid as well as reserve fire fighters. Station No. 2 has 1 engine, 2 paid fire-fighters and 5 to 6 reserve fire-fighters. Station No. 2's response time to an emergency call from proposed project site is 5 to 6 minutes.

Although any of the other stations in the city can respond to a call for assistance from Station No. 2, Station No. 4 is the nearest and would respond first. Station No. 4 is located at 2820 N. Walnut Road. City of Turlock Fire Services has mutual aid agreements with the Turlock Rural Fire District and the Mountainview Fire District. The mutual aid agreement isn't very specific in terms of actual numbers – equipment or fire fighters.

City of Turlock Fire Services has 4 fire fighters who are Haz Mat trained. These 4 fire fighters are part of a countywide Haz Mat response team. The Haz Mat team response time to an emergency at the proposed project site is 30 minutes. The somewhat longer response time is due to the necessity of calling in the entire countywide response team. The Haz Mat team is capable of handling any emergencies involving spills, e.g., anhydrous ammonia.

Fire Marshall McDaniel said that he did not expect the construction or operational phase of the project to have any impact on his services ability to respond to emergencies within its jurisdiction.

Catherine Larson informed me that Doctors Medical Center is one of two large hospitals in Modesto serving Stanislaus County and surrounding areas. The hospital has a number of on-site and off-site centers specializing in the care of patients. These centers include: California Cancer Center; California Neurological Sciences Center; Central California Diabetes Center; Central California Heart Center; Pediatrics; and Women and Children's Center. All of these centers are staffed by hospital staff as well as staff affiliated with the hospital.

In addition to the above services, the hospital has the Emergency and Trauma Services and Transport that constitutes the Emergency Department. The Trauma center is a major trauma receiving center.

Doctors Medical Center is a 397-bed hospital with a staff of about 560 doctors. In addition, most doctors in the area have hospital privileges.

Jonathan Carrol informed that Emanuel Medical Center was the only hospital in Turlock and that this is the hospital closest to the proposed project site. While the hospital does not have a Trauma Center, its ER can handle most minor injuries. The hospital has a helipad that enables them to move patients (once stabilized) to hospitals with the necessary facilities and resources.

Emanuel Medical Center is a 150-bed hospital with a staff of about 200 doctors.

Emanuel Medical Center has the following additional services: Advanced medical and surgical services; Intensive Care Unit; Neonatal Intensive Care Center; Respiratory Therapy; Physical Therapy; Diabetes care; Family Birth Center; and Wellness programs.

Ambulance services in the area are provided by American Medical Response (AMR).



Wendy called in response my earlier voicemail message to her. She informed me that Memorial Medical has 300 beds and has a staff of about 560 doctors. When I pointed out to her that this was the same number as that quoted by Doctors Medical Center, she said that there is quite a lot of overlap since most doctors in the area have hospital privileges at both hospitals.

Memorial Medical has the following specialized services: Cancer Services; Outpatient Disease Management Program; Intensive Care Unit; Neonatal Intensive Care Unit; Dialysis Center; Family Birthing Center; and 2 Outpatient Surgery centers.

Memorial Medical Center also has a Trauma Center that can handle most major traumas. The Trauma Center is scheduled to receive a Level II designation in 2003 (Pinto, 2002). The hospital also offers Medi-Flight services. It has a helipad and three helicopters (operating two at any given time).

The Turlock Irrigation District (TID) has contracted with my firm to help them put together an Application for Certification (AFC) for a new power plant. The AFC is an environmental document required by the California Energy Commission (CEC) as a condition of certification. TID has three potential sites for the project. As you pointed out in our telephone conversation today, two of these are in the Chatom Union Elementary School District and the third could be in the Turlock School Districts. All three sites are in the Turlock Joint Union High School.

In order to meet the CEC requirements for AFC preparation, I have to document all educational resources in the vicinity of the proposed project site. In addition to documenting the current school enrollment, I also need to document any potential impact that may result from the temporary relocation into the area of construction workers and their families as well as any school impact fees that the jurisdictional school district may assess.

As per our recent telephone conversation, I am requesting the following enrollment information for the Turlock School Districts and the Turlock Joint Union High School:

1. Enrollment by grade (K-12 or the appropriate breakdown) for the 2000/01 school year
2. Enrollment by grade (K-12 or the appropriate breakdown) for the 2001/02 school year
3. Enrollment by grade (K-12 or the appropriate breakdown) for the 2002/03 school year \*\*
4. Projected enrollment by grade (if available) for the 2003/04 school year.

\*\* I understand that your enrollment numbers at this time are projections based on last year's enrollment. I may contact you at a later date to confirm the enrollment numbers.

In addition to the above information, please send me information on the **school impact fee** assessed by your school district. Since I do not know how many construction workers might relocate to the area at this time, I will call at a later date to get your input on potential impacts to your school district, if any.

Captain Dodge informed me that the Turlock Police Service (TPS) located at 900 North Palm Street serves the City of Turlock from that one location. TPS has 75 sworn officers, 4 community service officers (with an additional 2 currently in the testing process), and about 20 patrol cars. The patrol cars all have laptop computers, and scanners. TPS has a dispatch center on the premises. The Dispatch center has an enhanced 911 system that enables the dispatchers to trace the origins of all calls with the exception of cell phone calls. At the moment all cell phone calls are routed to the CHP. The TPS is currently evaluating ways to incorporate calls from cell phones into their Dispatch system.

The response time to an emergency call from the proposed project site is approximately 4 minutes.

Captain Dodge said that he did not expect the construction or operational phase of the project to have any impact on his agency's ability to serve the rest of the community.

**Subject:** Fire Prevention Services

Mr. Fortado called in response to my earlier voicemail message to the District. He seemed to know about the project and the 3 sites possible sites proposed for the project. He informed me that of the three possible proposed sites, his district has jurisdiction over the two sites south of West Main. The station that receives the first call is the one at 690 West Canal Dr.

The station on 690 W. Canal has 3 Type 1 fire engines, 1 Type 1 water tender, 1 Type 1 rescue squad and 3 fast response attack vehicles. The fast response attack vehicles are small apparatus vehicles (called Type 4) staffed with a chief (or assistant chief) and a duty officer. The fast response attack vehicles move faster and are better able to maneuver in traffic. The station also has 30 fire fighters. All are 100% volunteer and are on call 24-hours a day, seven days a week. The response time to an emergency at the proposed project sites is 3-4 minutes.

The 690 W. Canal Dr. station has a mutual aid agreement from (1) Turlock City Fire Services Station #2 and (2) the Mountain View Fire District. Turlock City Fire Services Station # is located on 791 South Walnut Road. The Mountainview Fire District is located on the corner of Washington and Bradbury. The mutual aid agreement calls for each of these stations to supply one Type 1 engine with 2 firefighters and a chief officer.

Although, the Turlock Rural Fire District does not have a Haz Mat Team, all the firefighters have a First Responder Operational (FRO) certificates and they are the first responders to any emergencies involving spills, e.g., anhydrous ammonia. The response time to a haz mat emergency is 3-4 minutes.

Mr. Fortado said that he did not expect the construction or operational phase of the project to have any impact on his districts ability to respond to emergencies within its jurisdiction.

I explained to him about the project and asked him to help identify the school districts serving the 3 proposed sites for the project. He told me that all three proposed project sites are in the Chatom Union Elementary School District. Chatom Union Elementary School District schools only go up to the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade. The Turlock Joint Union High School District serves as the high school for students graduating from Chatom Union Elementary School District schools. I asked Mr. Smith for the current (2002/03) as well as projected (2003/04) enrollment by grade and any applicable impact fees that his district would charge the project. He suggested that I send him a written request and agreed that I could fax this request to him.

I faxed over a written request to him later that afternoon and also called him to ask that he acknowledge receipt of the fax when he received it.

Mr. Smith called me to confirm receipt of fax. He informed me that due to its status, the Turlock Irrigation District is exempt from school impact fees. He then proceeded to give me the enrollment numbers for the Turlock Joint Union High School District and the Turlock Joint Elementary School District. He also indicated that he was sending a written response to my request via regular mail.

I asked Mr. Smith for the current (2002/03) as well as projected (2003/04) enrollment by grade and any applicable impact fees that his district would charge the project. He suggested that I send him a written request and agreed that I could fax this request to him.


