I spoke with Brenda Roerden, Executive Assistant Administrator for the VacaValley Hospital. The hospital has a general acute care emergency center, but no trauma center. They do have a helipad and agreements to stat-flight patients to trauma centers after they have been stabilized at their facility. The closest trauma center, according to Ms. Roerden, is UCDavis. Typically patients are sent to various hospitals depending on the nature of the injuries. VacaValley Hospital is owned by NorthBay Healthcare, and is the sister hospital of NorthBay Medical Center. The hospital has 50 beds and around 200 physicians. VacaValley Hospital is located at 1000 Nut Tree Road Vacaville, CA.
