Hello Tony,

I would like to take opportunity to follow up on a phone call that I had with Tom Egan earlier. Some pointers that should be passed along and included in your minutes are as follows:

Any 404 Permit from Army Corp will require a 401 application be sent to us also. Also, they need to go through the steps to avoid, minimize, then mitigate.

We will want to review the delineation report for the waters.

It would be best to apply for a 401 (or WDR if a 404 is not applicable) for use of the horizontal directional drilling (HDD) method to install the pipeline through washes or drainages rather than trenching.

Thank you for taking steps to avoid impacts to Waters of the State. We greatly appreciate your efforts.
