Staff Workshop on Proposed Energy Efficiency Measures for Residential and Nonresidential Buildings

California Energy Commission staff is conducting a workshop to present draft revisions to be considered for inclusion in the 2016 *Building Energy Efficiency Standards* (Standards) (California Code of Regulations, Title 24, Parts 1 and 6). These draft revisions apply to residential and nonresidential buildings and include measures relating to the alternative compliance methods, compliance credit for installation of photovoltaic systems, Quality Insulation Installation (QII), and whole house fans. The workshop will be used to solicit public comment on proposed revisions to the Standards, and will be held:

Background

The Energy Commission is conducting a public process to consider and ultimately adopt changes to the Building Energy Efficiency Standards contained in the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 24, Part 6 (also known as the California Energy Code), and associated administrative regulations in Part 1, Chapter 10 (collectively referred to here as the Standards). Energy Commission staff has worked collaboratively with a number of stakeholders on the proposed measures being considered for inclusion in the Standards.

The following energy efficiency measures are being proposed for inclusion in the 2016 Standards, and will be presented:

1. Residential Alternative Compliance Methods (ACMs)
2. Nonresidential ACMs
3. Photovoltaic (PV) Compliance Credit with Quality Insulation Installation (QII)
4. Whole House Fan Compliance Credit (for low-rise residential construction)

Public Comment

The Energy Commission will be receiving public comments as a part of this workshop. Both oral and written comments may be submitted, with the following guidelines:

Oral comments. Staff will accept oral comments during the workshop. Comments may be limited to 5 minutes per speaker to ensure that all interested persons have the opportunity to speak. Written comments will be accepted at the workshop, however the Energy Commission may not have time to review them before the conclusion of the workshop; any such comments that are not addressed during the workshop will be reviewed by staff following the workshop.
