EXHIBIT A

Scope of Work

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to formalize the California Energy Commission's (Energy Commission) membership with the Collaborative for High Performance Schools, Inc. (CHPS). This membership allows the Energy Commission a seat on the Board of Directors and allows the Energy Commission to have a voice in advocating energy efficiency practices that go beyond the Title 24 Building Energy Efficiency Standards. Continued membership is essential to ensure school energy efficiency concerns are adequately addressed.

Founded in 1999 as a collaboration of California's major utilities to address energy efficiency in schools, CHPS. is a non-profit organization dedicated to making K-12 schools better places to learn. The program quickly expanded to address all aspects of school design, construction, operation, air quality and including energy efficiency. The Energy Commission is one of the founding members of the CHPS. organization and Commissioner McAllister is on the Board of Directors.

Since its founding, CHPS. has become the nationally recognized authority in energy efficient and sustainable school construction and moderation. Participants include the California Energy Commission, California Department of Education, Office of Public School Construction, Division of State Architect, California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery, all major California utilities, architects, school districts, and manufacturers. CHPS believes in the collaborative approach for the development of all of its resources.

SCOPE OF WORK:

This agreement provides funding for a membership in CHPS. for one year. The annual fee provides the Energy Commission full membership in the CHPS. and a seat on the Board of Directors, which entails the following:

- Participation in the Board of Directors' activities;
- The opportunity to positively influence critical state funding programs and policies of regulatory agencies.
- A forum to collaborate with peers in the California schools community;
- CHPS. staff support for programs and projects; and
- Exercise means to coordinate the Energy Commission's work with other state and utility programs related to schools and ensure school energy efficiency concerns are adequately addressed.
