The Under2 Coalition is composed by state and regional governments committed to keeping global temperature rises to below 2 degrees centigrade. The coalition consists of more 220 governments who represent over 1.3 billion people and 43 percent of the global economy. The coalition offers to its members, knowledge and information sharing through webinars, in-person meetings, policy reports and other studies. California is a member of the Under2 Coalition and one of the founding members. The Climate Group is the administrator for the Under2 Coalition and it will pay for Ms. ten Hope's air travel and lodging costs during the workshop period.

Section 3.2: Specific description of the payment and its agency purpose and use.

Laurie ten Hope, Deputy Director of the Energy Research and Development Division at the California Energy Commission (CEC), participated in the Industry Transition Platform (ITP) Workshop and address low carbon industry innovation challenges facing California's industries. This three-day workshop kicked off the platform and brought project participants representing state and regional governments together. The ITP connects highly industrialized, carbon-intensive states and regions to share transition experiences and successful initiatives and supports them to overcome barriers, and enables the transfer and adoption of innovative clean energy policies. A key objective of the workshop was to facilitate the formation of the project Innovation Teams around agreed upon low carbon innovation challenges facing industries. These Innovation Teams will work together for the rest of the project. It was therefore vital that all participating governments attend this workshop.

As the Deputy Director, Ms. ten Hope oversees a research program that funds over \$150 million projects annually. Approximately, \$94 million has been spent on research associated with the industrial sector. Ms. ten Hope engaged with a broad variety of stakeholders at the workshop and worked together to share California's experiences and successes. She also learned about other innovative technologies/strategies from other governments that can help California industries meet greenhouse gas reduction goals and stay competitive in the global market.

Travel Payment Information: The Climate Group covered the costs during the workshop period from April 3-5 and this includes the night before April 2 and the night of April 5. The State of California covered the cost for the night of April 1 and all food and miscellaneous costs not covered by the workshop, and all ground transportation costs in Milan and Sacramento.
