EXHIBIT A Scope of Work

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to fund the Energy Commission's membership in the American Institute of Chemical Engineers Center for Hydrogen Safety (CHS).

The CHS is a voluntary public/private organization that promotes hydrogen refueling station safety and best practices. The CHS also conducts safety evaluations for hydrogen projects and facilities that use hydrogen. Formed in 2019, the CHS is a technical entity of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) which was established in 1908. The CHS members include industrial gas companies, hydrogen refueling station developers and operators, energy companies, fuel cell technology companies, and government entities. The CHS has six membership levels that include an Executive Board, Small Industry and Large Industry, University, Government, and National Laboratories. The Executive Board members pay \$50,000/year and their mission includes participating the CHS resource planning, directing safety tool development, and setting priorities. The non-Board members implement the strategies and policies.

In the past, the Clean Transportation Program relied on safety expertise from the U.S. Department of Energy Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) Hydrogen Safety Panel (HSP), which is transitioning its activities to the CHS.

Energy Commission will pay \$50,000 to be used for the operating expenses for the CHS fiscal year 2021. The annual fee provides the Clean Transportation Program with Executive Board membership in the CHS from April 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021. The membership provides the following benefits of participation and engagement:

- Participation in the Executive Board and project teams;
- The opportunity to participate in decision making that advances safety best practices and norms for fuel cell electric vehicles, hydrogen transport, and hydrogen refueling;
- Collaboration in one of the most visible public fora with peers in hydrogen safety;
- Participation in the strategic planning and development of safety products and the Safety Plans used by Clean Transportation Program funded hydrogen refueling stations; and
- A high degree of visibility and recognition through the CHS outreach activities.

RESOLVED, that the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission (CEC) adopts the staff CEQA findings contained in the Agreement or Amendment Request Form (as applicable); and
