Project Summary:

The purpose of this Agreement is for:

- 1. California Energy Commission (CEC) to collect and compile cultural resources data into an inventory in a consolidated GIS platform;
- 2. CEC to provide the Ocean Protection Council (OPC), California Coastal Commission (CC), State Lands Commission (SLC), California Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW), California State Parks (SP), and the federal Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) (collectively, "Agencies") access to the cultural resources inventory per data sharing agreement(s) for use in evaluating offshore wind (OSW) energy development and potential related impacts off the California coast;
- 3. CEC to award grants to seven North Coast tribes—Bear River Band of the Rohnerville Rancheria, Wiyot Tribe, Blue Lake Rancheria, Cher-Ae Heights Indian Community of the Trinidad Rancheria, Big Lagoon Rancheria, Resighini Rancheria, and the Yurok Tribe (collectively, "North Coast Tribes")—to fund coordination and consultations between the North Coast Tribes and the Agencies concerning the collection, compilation, sharing and confidentiality of the inventory; and
- 4. CEC to provide North Coast Tribes access to the cultural resources inventory per data sharing agreement(s).

The Agencies will need to, readily and repeatedly, access cultural resources inventory data over the course of several years of environmental review and compliance actions related to OSW energy development in federal waters offshore of North Coast areas of California and related state water and onshore impacts and development. Additionally, BOEM is interested in how the state-collected information will aid its efforts to work with tribes for the identification of cultural landscapes that might intersect state and federal jurisdictions. The Agencies will individually and collectively need to consult with the North Coast Tribes (and perhaps additional tribes) concerning those actions. In preparing for that state jurisdictional work, the CEC will need to share the inventory with the Agencies and the North Coast Tribes to aid the broader state (and federal) consultation activities. Inventory sharing will require data sharing agreements.



General Description of the Project

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Platform

Inventory data will be gathered by CEC Cultural Resources Unit staff (CEC staff) from the sources identified in tasks 1 through 4 below. Information will be consistently digitized across all inventory sets to include geographic location and attribution defined by schema. Some data sets will be received in digital format and some data sets will need to be converted to digital format.

A centralized digital platform will be established that stores all information collected, shares that information with the Agencies and North Coast Tribes, and secures that information with individual username/password authorization as further described in data sharing agreements. A training program will be established, as some Agencies and North Coast Tribes' staff will need to learn to use the GIS platform.

CEC staff will use its established cultural resource digital inventory data schema and ArcGIS Online platform to help accomplish the Agreement goals.

North Coast Geographic Study Area

The North Coast inventories will be collected for the following geographic areas, generally defined as:

- Western extent: State ocean waters boundary (3 nautical miles offshore)
- Southern extent: Southern end of Centerville Beach
- Northern extent: Northern end of Freshwater Lagoon
- Eastern extent: Coastal Zone eastern boundary

Objective:

The goal of this Agreement is for the Agencies and North Coast Tribes to share a common collection of cultural resources data to help inform future state actions related to OSW energy development.

Project Tasks and Deliverables:

Task 1: CONDUCT CHRIS RECORDS SEARCH

Subtask 1a. Conduct Records Search. CEC staff will conduct a records search at the Northwest Information Center (NWIC) of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) for the North Coast Geographic Study Area (defined above). Staff will consult the NWIC's database of previously recorded cultural resources to obtain the geographic location of each cultural resource situated in the study area and the associated resource recordation forms (portable document format [PDF]).

Subtask 1b. Digitize Records. CEC staff will incorporate the location of each cultural resource into the project GIS, creating individual shapefiles. Staff will complete an attribute table, which will allow database users to access and search for diverse information, for each cultural resource. Staff will link each shapefile with PDFs of the associated resource recordation forms.

Deliverable:

PDFs and attributed shapefiles of resource recordation forms. CEC staff will incorporate these data into the project GIS.

Task 2: COLLECT ETHNOGRAPHIC RECORDS

Subtask 2a. Visit State Archives and Collect Ethnographic Documents and Maps. CEC staff will access ethnographic records at the State Archives, California State Library, internet sources, and CEC's Cultural Resources Unit library. The research will focus on Wiyot and Yurok cultural geography, including village locations, ceremonial areas, gathering locales, and important viewsheds. Many of these resource types are underrepresented in the CHRIS records. Staff will photocopy or acquire digital versions of maps and documents for analysis and digitization.

Subtask 2b. Georeference Maps. Some of the major Wiyot and Yurok sources contain detailed maps of numerous village sites and other important landscape features. The maps are sufficiently detailed that staff will incorporate entire maps into the project GIS through a process called georeferencing. This process shortens digitization time to a considerable degree while maintaining high accuracy standards.

Subtask 2c. Digitize Resource Information. CEC staff will create individual data sheets (PDF format) for cultural resources identified in the ethnographic sources and create shapefiles in the project GIS for each. Information from the data sheets will be added to the GIS and shapefiles linked to PDFs of their corresponding data sheets. Finally, staff will compile a list of coastal plant and animal species important to the Wiyot and Yurok.

Deliverable:

PDF data sheets and attributed shapefiles of cultural resources found on ethnographic maps. CEC staff will incorporate these data into the project GIS. Lists of culturally important, coastal plant and animal species (Word and PDF format).

Task 3: COLLECT SUBMERGED CULTURAL RESOURCES DATA

The SLC and BOEM possess two significant data sets concerning submerged cultural resources: the Submerged Shipwreck Database and Coastal Paleolandscapes. CEC staff will work with SLC staff to obtain the shipwreck data for the study area and BOEM to access the Coastal Paleo-landscapes data set. BOEM possesses predictive modeling data that provide offshore modeling of coastal paleo-landscapes for lands under federal ocean waters. Working with BOEM historic preservation staff, CEC staff will extrapolate that data to determine North Coast paleo-landscapes for lands under state waters and within the study area.

Deliverable: CEC staff will incorporate the data relevant to the study area into the project GIS and create individual cultural resource records (PDF format).



Task 4: OBTAIN ADDITIONAL STATE OR TRIBAL DATA SETS

Other partnering state agencies or tribes might have unique data sets that they wish to share. CEC staff will contact partnering state agencies and tribes to determine if they possess, and would be willing to provide, unique cultural resource data sets to CEC. Staff will evaluate any such data sets for digital compatibility with the project GIS. Individual cultural resources will be digitized into the GIS, attribute tables completed, and PDFs of source documents linked to resource shapefiles.

Deliverable: Attributed shapefiles and PDF-format source documents, each incorporated

into the project GIS.

Task 5: STATE-TRIBAL FUNDING AGREEMENTS, DATA-SHARING AGREEMENTS, AND SUMMARY OF CULTURAL RESOURCES INVENTORY

The CEC will attempt to execute up to seven grant agreements with North Coast Tribes to build their capacity to participate in the project. CEC will administer any grant agreements it executes with North Coast Tribes. The reason these are grants instead of contracts is that no goods or services are being provided to the State. Within certain parameters, the North Coast Tribes will decide how best to participate and contribute towards this collective effort. Grant activities may include compensation for activities such as tribal staff time expended in team meetings, GIS training, peer reviewing staff work, and providing additional data. Information/data collected via Tasks 1–4 will be cross-validated with Tribes to the extent feasible through individual and group meetings. Grant funds may also be used to purchase ESRI ArcGIS Online licenses, if needed.

The CEC will attempt to negotiate and execute data-sharing agreements with the Agencies and North Coast Tribes interested in accessing the cultural resources data compiled under tasks 1–4 of this scope of work. These data-sharing agreements will, at minimum, define what inventory information will be kept confidential and the allowable uses of the information.

Instructions for accessing and using the project GIS will be delivered to each Agency and North Coast Tribe, conditional upon execution of data-sharing agreements with the CEC.

Additionally, the CEC will prepare a summary of the cultural resources inventory as a baseline reference for partner tribes and agencies. The summary will describe, in a manner suitable for public distribution, the number and types of cultural resources identified in the study area. An overview of the predictive modeling for submerged archaeological resources will be provided. An ethnographic resources summary will also include an overview of the lists of plants and animals of importance to Wiyot and Yurok tribes with general reference to how the data might be used to characterize tribal cultural resources including tribal cultural landscapes. The summary will also describe





the sources and repositories that the CEC consulted in preparing the cultural

resources inventory.

Deliverable: Draft CEC-Tribal Grant Funding Agreements, Copies of Final CEC-Tribal

Grant Funding Agreements, Draft Data-Sharing Agreements, Copies of Final Data-Sharing Agreements, Instructions and password for project GIS, and

Summary of Cultural Resources Inventory.

Task 6: CONDUCT TEAM MEETINGS AND TRAINING

This scope of work will require CEC staff to work in task-specific teams on parallel tracks to complete all tasks during the Agreement term. In addition, Agencies and North Coast Tribes would benefit from training in the use of ArcGIS Online and the project GIS. Therefore, the goal of this task is to ensure the coordination of Agreement tasks, quality assurance and control, and directions for use of the project GIS. This task will include periodic and ad hoc team meetings among CEC staff (and other participants as appropriate) and online training sessions with Agencies and North Coast Tribes on use of the

project GIS.

Deliverable: Online training sessions as needed by Agencies and North Coast Tribes.
