**Section 2: Donor**

The Department of Foreign and Overseas Chinese Affairs, Sichuan Provincial People's Government Department of Hong Kong & Macao Affairs, Sichuan Provincial People's Government (Sichuan Foreign Affairs Office) is the Provincial-level government department of Sichuan, China primarily responsible for coordinating and regulating foreign affairs activities and international relations in the province. Some of the primary duties of the Sichuan Foreign Affairs Office are to coordinate and regulate foreign affairs activities and international relations in the province and to oversee protocol arrangements and the reception of foreign visitors. In May 2018, the City of Chengdu hosted the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual U.S.-China Governor's Forum, which Chair Weisenmiller attended on behalf of Governor Brown and the State of California.

**Section 3.2: Payment Description**

By attending the 4<sup>th</sup> U.S.-China Governor's Forum on behalf of Governor Brown, Chair Weisenmiller helped advance the California-China Clean Technology Partnership (CCCTP), which was established by Governor Brown in June 2017. Additionally, Chair Weisenmiller was able to provide other national and subnational jurisdictions with information regarding California's effective clean energy and environmental policy development and implementation. Finally, through continued engagement with China, there are significant lessons for California to learn from technological and policy advancements in China that can help the state meet its ambitious climate goals.
