EXHIBIT A

Scope of Work

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to fund the California Energy Commission's membership in the International Zero-Emission Vehicle Alliance (ZEV Alliance).

Background

The ZEV Alliance is an association formed by nations and subnational jurisdictions to accelerate adoption of Zero-Emission Vehicles (ZEVs). It is a high-profile platform for ZEV announcements, and jurisdictions will work together to set and achieve individual and collective targets for future ZEV deployment.

The International Council on Clean Transportation (ICCT) operates the ZEV Alliance under the direction of Alliance members. Operations include coordinating the activities of participants; organizing and moderating meetings, including monthly teleconferences and an annual in-person meeting; preparing meeting summaries and follow-up work; being a primary point of contact for interested parties including news media; promoting and representing the ZEV Alliance through press releases and at conferences and other events; providing and maintaining a website and online presence; maintaining records of the ZEV Alliance; collecting data and providing data, research, analysis, and reports on topics of interest to members; manage and report on funding of ZEV Alliance activities; and manage contracts with other parties, as necessary.

ZEV Alliance participants are expected to provide funding to ICCT to cover the joint activities undertaken by the ZEV Alliance. Membership funds shall be administered by ICCT and used to provide management services to facilitate and coordinate the cooperative efforts of the ZEV Alliance, including operational; financial; contractual and project management services; and responding to media and public inquiries about the Alliance.

SCOPE OF WORK

The California Energy Commission will pay \$15,000 for a one-year membership in the ZEV Alliance. The benefits of membership include:

- Receipt of reports analyzing international electric vehicle market and policy developments;
- Input and influence on future membership recruitment actions;
- Participation in monthly virtual meetings and an annual, in-person meeting.
