Andrew McAllister International Conference on Energy Efficiency in Cities (CIEEC) Puebla, Mexico February 17-18, 2016

PURPOSE OF THE TRIP

Commissioner McAllister, the lead commissioner for energy efficiency, has been invited to participate as a panelist in the *International Conference on Energy Efficiency in Cities*, to be held in Puebla, Mexico on February 17-18, 2016.

The Conference seeks to bring national and international high-level participants, from both local and national governments, along with other important stakeholders to better understand the very practical barriers and constraints that need to be addressed and surpassed, identify practical and implementable delivery models and necessary elements for an enabling environment that can be adapted and put in place to deliver and scale-up energy efficiency in cities.

HOW THIS EVENT FULFILS THE COMMISSIONS' OFFICIAL BUSINESS GOALS

Commissioner McAllister is the lead commissioner for energy efficiency at the California Energy Commission.
