Chair Robert B. Weisenmiller will participate and speak at the ICEF, which is hosted by METI and the New Energy and Industrial Technology Development Organization (NEDO). ICEF aims to promote proactive discussions and cooperation among leading researchers, business persons, and policymakers from around the world to address climate change through innovation. The Chair's participation will further the commitments under various MOUs between Japan and California that focus on DC Fast Charging infrastructure for Electric Vehicles and Redox Flow Battery Energy Storage. The trip will also allow the Chair to meet with members of Japan's Nuclear Regulatory Authority to discuss issues of mutual concern regarding nuclear decommissioning and storage of nuclear waste at facilities located in seismically vulnerable coastal locations.
