Section 2: Describe the entity's business activity or its nature and interests.

The Western Interstate Energy Board is an organization of 11 Western States and three western Canadian Provinces. The legal basis of the Energy Board is the Western Interstate Nuclear Compact (Public Law 91-461). The governor of each state and the premier of each province appoints a member to the Board. The purpose of the Board is to provide the instruments and framework for cooperative state efforts to enhance the economy of the West. The Board seeks to achieve this purpose by promoting energy policy that is developed cooperatively among member states and with the federal government.

Section 3.2: Specific description of the payment and its agency purpose and use.

Janea A. Scott, a Commissioner at the California Energy Commission (CEC) will travel to Denver, Colorado as part of a Western Interconnection Regional Advisory Body (WIRAB) delegation. Commissioner Scott is currently serving as the Chair of WIRAB, which was created under Section 215(j) of the Federal Power Act. WIRAB's membership includes representatives from all states and international provinces within the Western Interconnection (the same western group that is also in the Western Interstate Energy Board).

The purpose of the delegation trip is to bring the leadership team and other invited guests together to informally discuss the vision, priorities, and funding opportunities for WIRAB, the Western Interstate Energy Board (WIEB), the Committee on Regional Electric Power Cooperation (CREPC), and the Energy Imbalance Market – Body of State Regulators (EIM-BOSR).

The retreat provides a valuable opportunity for Commissioner Scott to provide California's perspective on the direction and priorities of WIRAB, WIEB, CREPC, and EIM-BOSR. As the WIRAB Chair, Commissioner Scott will take an active, leading role in shaping the discussion around important issues.
