Matt Coldwell, Advisor to Commissioner Janea A. Scott at the California Energy Commission, participated at the Center for the New Energy Economy's (CNEE) *Repowering the Western Economy* meeting in Denver, Colorado. CNEE has been facilitating a multi-state dialogue to identify the key challenges facing the electricity sector in the West and how to address those challenges through enhanced regional coordination and state policy.

CNEE's *Repowering the Western Economy* meeting provides a valuable opportunity for California energy leaders to provide California's perspective on western energy planning issues.
