
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National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program

Background

- 1. Created by the Infrastructure and Investment Jobs Act of 2021
- 2. \$384M for California over 5 years
- 3. Must submit an annual deployment plan
- 4. Partnership between CEC and Caltrans






National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program

Program Objectives

- 1. Support DC fast charging stations
- 2. At least four fast chargers every 50 miles or less
- 3. 50% of chargers must be in DAC/LIC & 40% in Justice40 communities





Interagency Agreement Overview

✓Formalizes partnership between CEC and Caltrans

✓ Makes CEC official lead for NEVI administration

✓ Covers the duration of the NEVI program





Scope of Work

- 1. Annually update NEVI Deployment Plan
- 2. Designate federal Alternative Fuel Corridors
- 3. Develop and manage NEVI funding opportunities
- 4. Develop and manage NEVI project agreements



Benefit to Californians

- Deploys a predictable and reliable network of fast chargers
- Creates good-paying jobs
- Boosts in-state EV charging manufacturing
- Enables greater population of zero-emission vehicles
