





- Data needed for analysis and reporting of refinery costs and profits
- Reporting improvements:
 - Increases visibility into refiner cost structures
 - New sales channel reporting requirements
 - Clarifies Gross and Net Margin calculations





- Data for near-term petroleum supply analysis
- Reporting improvements:
 - Improves detail on product purchases
 - Improves vessel tracking information
 - Clarifies reporting entities and timelines
