[PROPOSED] ORDER FINDING COMPLIANCE WITH PUBLIC UTILITIES CODE SECTION 9621

I. BACKGROUND

Pursuant to Senate Bill 350 (Stats. 2015, ch. 547), Public Utilities Code (PUC) section 9621 requires publicly owned utilities with an annual electrical demand exceeding 700 gigawatt hours to adopt integrated resource plans (IRPs) at least once every five years and submit them to the California Energy Commission. The IRPs must contain supporting information sufficient to demonstrate that they meet certain requirements, including greenhouse gas emission reduction targets and renewable energy procurement goals, as set forth in PUC section 9621. Under PUC section 9622, the Energy Commission must review IRPs for consistency with these requirements. On October 4, 2018, the Energy Commission adopted the *Publicly Owned Utility Integrated Resource Plan Submission and Review Guidelines* to govern the submission of IRPs.

II. STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that SMUD's 2022 IRP, filed on September 14, 2022, under Docket Number 18-IRP-01, be found complete and consistent with the requirements of PUC section 9621.

III. ENERGY COMMISSION FINDINGS

- a. On September 14, 2022, SMUD submitted an IRP and supporting documentation to the Energy Commission (the IRP Filing);
- b. On September 14, 2022, the Energy Commission posted the IRP Filing on its website under Docket Number 18-IRP-01, TN Nos. 246074 – 246081, for public comment. No public comments were submitted;

- c. Energy Commission staff reviewed the IRP Filing and found it to be complete and consistent with the requirements of PUC section 9621;
- d. On February 6, 2024, the Energy Commission notified SMUD that its IRP Filing was complete;
- e. On April 26, 2024, the Director of the Energy Commission's Energy Assessments Division signed a letter informing SMUD that she had determined the IRP Filing to be consistent with the requirements of PUC section 9621; and
- f. The Energy Commission concurs with staff's recommendation that SMUD's IRP Filing is complete and consistent with the requirements of PUC section 9621.

IV. CONCLUSION AND ORDER

The California Energy Commission hereby adopts staff's recommendation and orders that SMUD's IRP Filing complies with requirements set forth in Public Utilities Code section 9621.
