Benefit to Californians

- Preserves performance of televisions in California
- Creates consistency across products
- Keeps efficiency prioritized
- Saves consumers money





Overview



- Staff are seeking an Order Instituting Rulemaking (OIR) to pursue standards for televisions and displays that:
 - Maintain continuity in California's successful efficiency program, affecting 34 million devices
 - Leverage the latest federal test
 - Address 6+ TWh of annual energy demand



Historic Context

- **January 1, 2006** – Standby mode energy use limited to 3W
- **January 1, 2011** – Products must enter standby mode, and must have separate home and retail modes
- **January 1, 2013** – On-mode energy use limited based on screen area using state test, standby energy use limited to 1W
- **April 14, 2023** – ANSI/CTA-2037-D federally adopted
- **July 19, 2024** – Data certification updated



Proposed Action

- Staff propose adoption of an Order Instituting Rulemaking
- The CEC's next steps would include:
 - data gathering,
 - convening a workgroup,
 - identifying alternatives, and
 - drafting a staff report
