Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, Section 15306 provides that projects which consist of basic data collection, research, experimental management, and resource evaluation activities which do not result in a serious or major disturbance to an environmental resource are exempt from CEQA. This project involves research, data gathering, resource evaluation and paper studies for a Climate Change Assessment Plan. All of these activities fit within Section 15306.

This project is covered by the Common Sense Exemption under Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, Section 15061(b)(3), which provides that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.

The project will occur on tribal lands held in trust by the United States. For the CEC to comply with CEQA, the CEC must evaluate any impacts to land within the jurisdiction of the State of California, which is therefore limited to potential impacts of the project off of tribal trust lands.

This project consists of development of a Climate Change Assessment Plan to identify basic policies, requirements, responsibilities and duties that apply to the PRCI's natural resources such as traditional food plants and trees currently being impacted by climate change through consultation with tribal elders and field data gathering. Project activities do not include burning or any other activity that may have an impact to land off of tribal trust lands.



Grant Request Form CEC-270 (Revised 01/2024)

Because the proposed project does not provide for any physical changes outside of the PRCI's tribal trust lands, it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the proposed project may have a significant effect on environment within the jurisdiction of the State of California. Based on all these factors, the proposed project meets the CEQA "common sense" exemption. This project is also exempt under Section 15306.

The project will not impact an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped, and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; does not involve any cumulative impacts of successive projects of the same type in the same place that might be considered significant; does not involve unusual circumstances that might have a significant effect on the environment; will not result in damage to scenic resources within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway; the project site is not included on any list compiled pursuant to Government Code section 65962.5; and the project will not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource. Therefore, none of the exceptions to categorical exemptions listed in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2 apply to this project, and this project will not have a significant effect on the environment.

Overview:

The Picayune Rancheria of the Chukchansi Indians (PRCI) is located in Madera County, California, in the foothills below the Yosemite Valley. Over the past several years the community has been impacted by weather-related distress that heightened the need to protect the PRCI's natural resources and also to maintain cultural benefits of these resources.

The purpose of this project is to inventory and monitor PRCI's natural resources to protect these natural and cultural assets. This project will:

- develop basic policies, requirements, responsibilities, and duties that apply to the PRCI's natural resources
- develop a Climate Change Assessment Plan to serve as a guide for current and future efforts to mitigate the impacts of climate change
- build climate change resilience for the community
