Scope of Work

PURPOSE

This Agreement will formalize the California Energy Commission's (CEC) sponsorship of the American Council for an Energy Efficient Economy (ACEEE) 2025 Summer Study on Energy Efficiency in Industry. This Platinum level sponsorship provides the CEC with the following:

- 3-minute welcoming remarks at plenary session;
- ACEEE-approved announcement sent via the virtual platform during conference;
- Preconference attendee list including names, titles, and organizations only;
- Sponsor table in a high-visibility area;
- Recognition on meeting room splash slides;
- Placement of logo on conference website with link to chosen webpage;
- Recognition of sponsorship on all pre- and post-event emails;
- Sponsor page on virtual platform to host content about your organization, including collateral, weblinks, and videos for attendees to view and download (content depending on sponsorship level); and
- 8 Event registration waivers.

The 2025 Summer Study on Energy Efficiency in Industry will focus on achievable action plans for decarbonization. Ambitious decarbonization goals have helped spur the manufacturing sector to begin seriously exploring how to reduce emissions. This event will host discussions on the path forward and what federal policy developments mean for various stakeholders such as states and regional organizations.

The conference will feature four tracks of presentations:

- Track 1: Grids, Pipelines, and Funding (i.e. collaboration between utilities, government, and industry)
- Track 2: Technology and Operations (i.e. improving internal operations and reducing waste in industrial facilities)
- Track 3: Bringing New Energy to Leadership (i.e. creating opportunities for leaders across facilities, companies, and sectors)
- Track 4: Collaborating through Complexity: Navigating Industrial Value Chains (i.e. bringing together the data, financing, and innovation to achieve strategic goals in supply chains)
