PURPOSE OF THE TRIP

Commissioner McAllister, the lead commissioner for energy efficiency, has been invited to participate as a panelist in the *International Conference on Energy Efficiency in Cities*, to be held in Puebla, Mexico on February 17-18, 2016.

The Conference seeks to bring national and international high-level participants, from both local and national governments, along with other important stakeholders to better understand the very practical barriers and constraints that need to be addressed and surpassed, identify practical and implementable delivery models and necessary elements for an enabling environment that can be adapted and put in place to deliver and scale-up energy efficiency in cities.

HOW THIS EVENT FULFILLS THE COMMISSIONS' OFFICIAL BUSINESS GOALS

Commissioner McAllister is the lead commissioner for energy efficiency at the California Energy Commission. This two-day event will be devoted to energy efficient cities and will take place within the *2016 Latin American edition of the Smart City Expo World Congress*. The meeting seeks to deepen knowledge and understanding of the elements and foundation that are missing and needed to scale-up energy efficiency in cities. Commissioner McAllister's experience and contribution to the discussions will be highly relevant and interesting for the event.

Regarding the "CA-Mexico MOU", the interest in Energy Efficiency is a key factor to Mexico's ongoing restructuring of the electric sector, going forward.

His participation helps highlight and expand CA's leadership on Energy and Climate issues. This is a global movement, in which CA is the lead.

Further, this trip also allows Commissioner McAllister to pursue CEC interests in Mexico while there. (for example: meetings with various high-end officials from many countries.)
