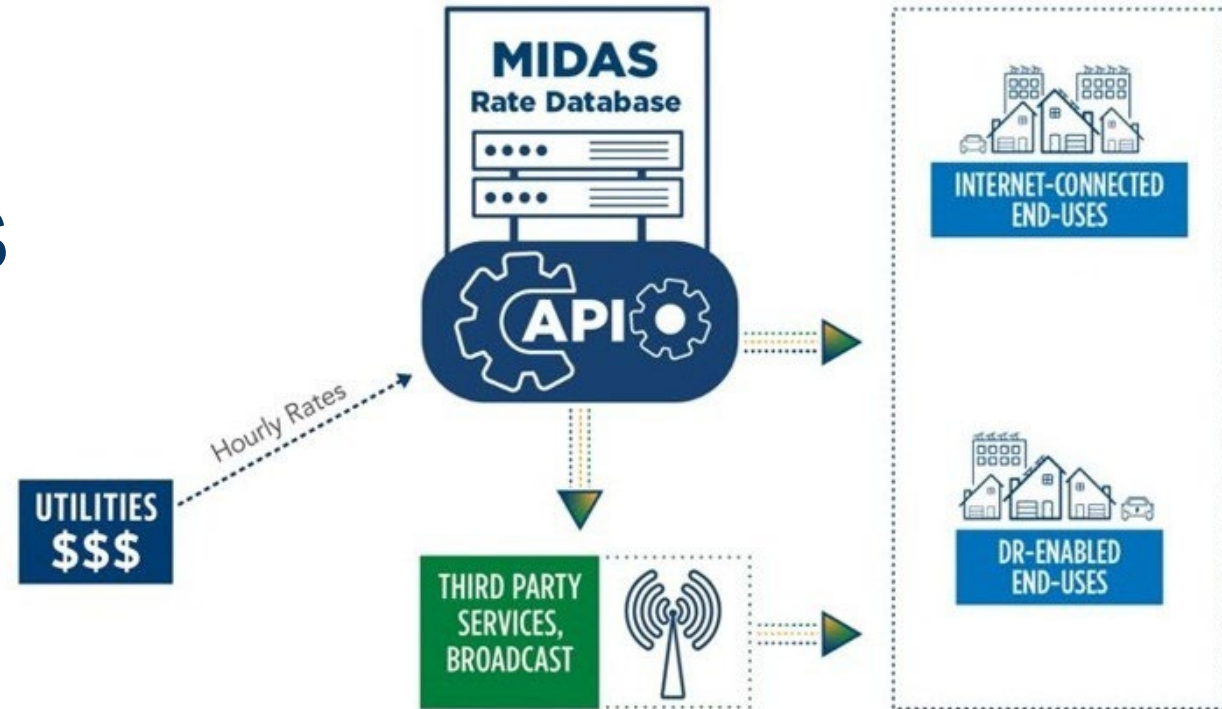
LMS Benefits to Californians

Requirements:

- Dynamic hourly rates
- Automation via MIDAS

Benefits:

- Lower cost
- Better grid resilience

Statewide Tool Extension

- Executive Director Found Good Cause
- Extension to May 8, 2026
- Conditioned Approval for CCAs and POUs



CCA Compliance Plans: Ava & CPASC

CCAs: Ava & CPASC

- Participation of CalFUSE dynamic rate pilots



LADWP Compliance Plan

- Marginal cost-based rates not technologically feasible
- Load management program - EV managed charging with MIDAS integration



SMUD Compliance Plan

- SMUD's plan:
 - Marginal cost-based rates not cost-effective due to low participation projection
 - Current load management portfolio has wide coverage
- Staff recommendation:
 - Conditional approval with future re-evaluation



Staff Recommendations

- Not a CEQA project
- Approve all 4 compliance plans with applicable conditions
