

University of Michigan Energy Institute's Transportation, Economics, Energy and the Environment (TE3) Conference brings together federal policymakers, state policymakers, automakers, charging providers and researchers to explore the changing economics of mobility given electrification, evolving business models and federal actions to undermine California's vehicle standards. The conference themes are cutting edge and capture tensions between current low fuel prices and tightening fuel economy and GHG emissions standards, as well as longer-term issues around aligning infrastructure, fuel, vehicle design, and consumer education for a sustainable future.
