

# Senate Bill 605: Evaluation of Feasibility, Costs, and Benefits of Wave and Tidal Energy Resources



#### **Senate Bill 605**

The CEC must, in consultation with other state agencies, evaluate the feasibility, costs, and benefits of using wave and tidal energy, including:

- Factors increasing use of wave and tidal energy resources
- Transmission and permitting requirements
- Economic and workforce development needs
- Near-term actions for investments and workforce development
- Economic feasibility
- Monitoring strategies




