MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

IDENTIFICATION OF COMPATIBILITY ISSUES BETWEEN RENEWABLE ENERGY RESOURCES AND MILITARY TESTING. TRAINING. AND READINESS

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into by the Governor's Office of Planning and Research ("OPR") and the California Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission ("ENERGY COMMISSION") with respect to the following:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, producing electricity from renewable resources provides multiple and significant benefits to California's environment and economy, including improving local air quality and reducing global warming pollution, diversifying energy supply, improving energy security, enhancing economic development, and creating jobs; and

WHEREAS, California has some of the best renewable energy resource areas in the world, providing immense potential for clean, valuable electricity generation in the State, and the development of these resources and associated infrastructure must be accelerated to meet the State's greenhouse gas reduction and renewable energy goals; and

WHEREAS, California contains over 30 Department of Defense ("DoD") installations (DoD) installations, which employ 295,000 civilian and military personnel and contribute significantly to the state's economy with approximately \$47.0 billion in direct spending each year; and

WHEREAS, significant DoD military testing, training, and operations areas are located in and off the coast of California, which could be adversely impacted by the siting of new renewable energy projects and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, such adverse impacts include, but are not limited to, radar interference from utility-scale wind turbines, low level flight obstructions associated with tall structures such as wind turbines and electric transmission lines, electromagnetic interference from high voltage electric transmission lines, and glint and glare impacts to flight operations associated with solar projects near military airfields; and

WHEREAS, OPR, which serves the Governor and his Cabinet as staff for long-range planning and research, and constitutes the comprehensive state planning agency, and the ENERGY COMMISSION, which has led several science-based collaborative landscape-level planning efforts for renewable energy as the state's primary energy planning agency, should continue to work together cohesively to address and identify both areas of concern and areas of opportunity

to help facilitate renewable energy development and preserve military readiness, while enhancing economic and energy security needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and representations made herein, the Agencies hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF PLANNING AND RESEARCH (OPR) will be the lead agency in this effort to evaluate potential areas for renewable energy development and promote project siting compatibility with DoD missions in California. This will include an evaluation of federal, state, and local permitting and siting processes for renewable energy.
- 2. The effort will result in an interactive mapping tool, the California Military Energy Opportunity Compatibility Assessment Mapping Project (CaMEO CAMP), along with a California Military and Energy Land Use Summary.
- 3. The ENERGY COMMISSION will provide in-kind matching resources in the form of staff support to:
 - a. Assist OPR in evaluating consultant proposals, including consultant selection and scoring;
 - b. Review of planning materials and work product deliverables;
 - c. Provide technical expertise regarding energy siting, associated transmission, and potential environmental compatibility issues;
 - d. Attend technical meetings and other tasks as necessary;
 - e. Participate in public outreach and stakeholder engagement.
- 4. The ENERGY COMMISSION will submit a quarterly report of CEC activities to OPR.
- 5. This MOU may be amended in writing in the same manner the MOU was entered.
- 6. This MOU shall take effect on the date that it has been executed and shall continue in effect until June 30, 2023, unless terminated earlier or extended.
