- Energy Conservation Assistance Act Program
- Fifth Climate Assessment Tribal Research Grant Program
- Clean Transportation Projects



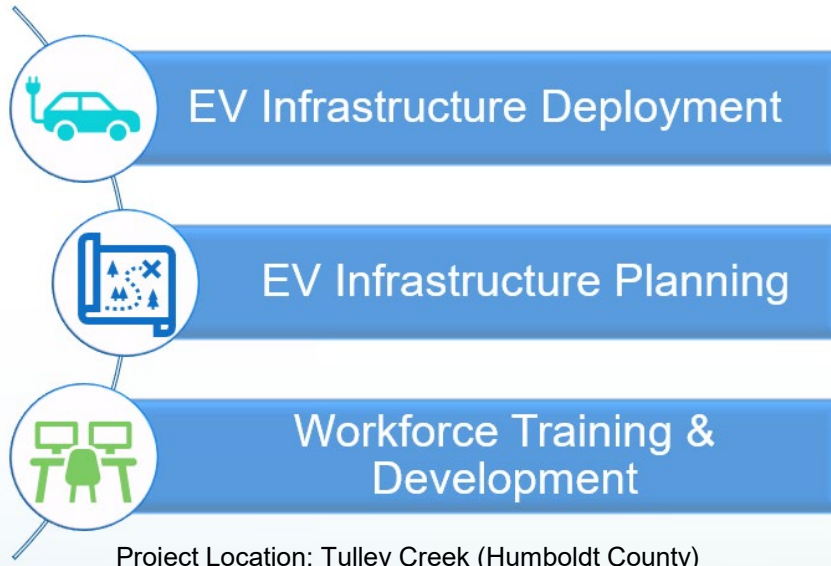
Yesterday the CEC approved \$5 million in EV funding for 3 projects

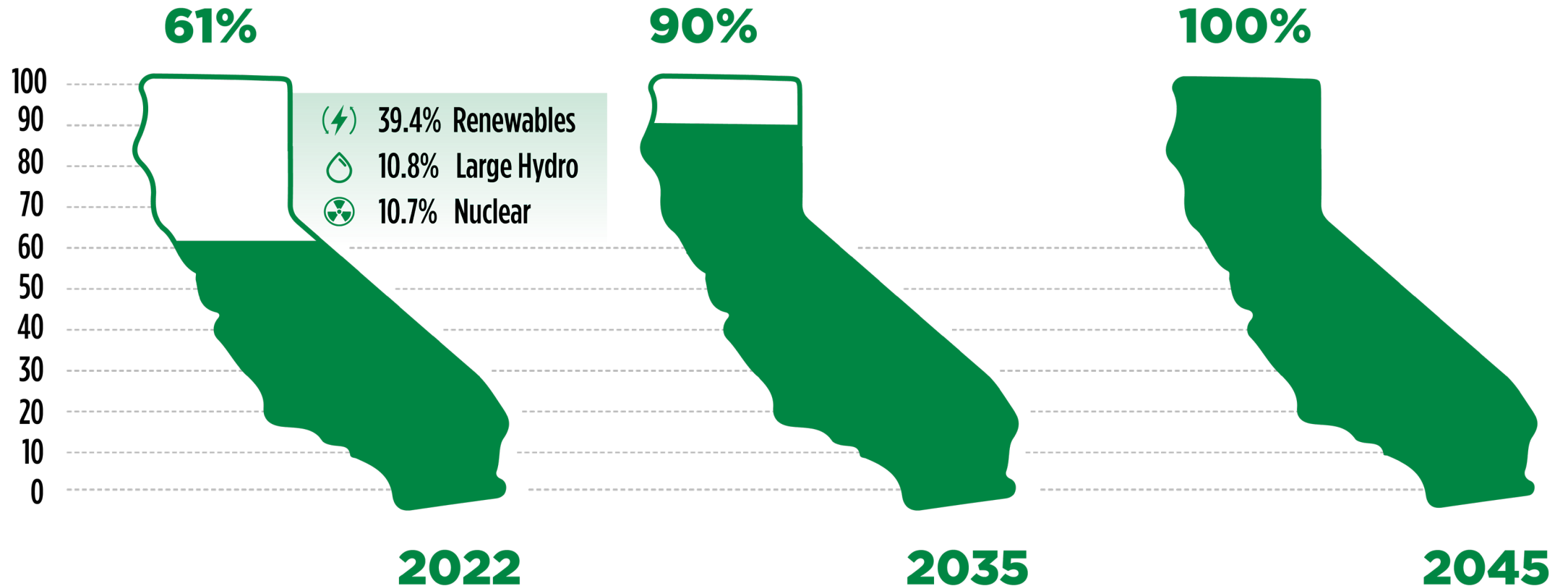

California is on track to achieve 100% clean electricity

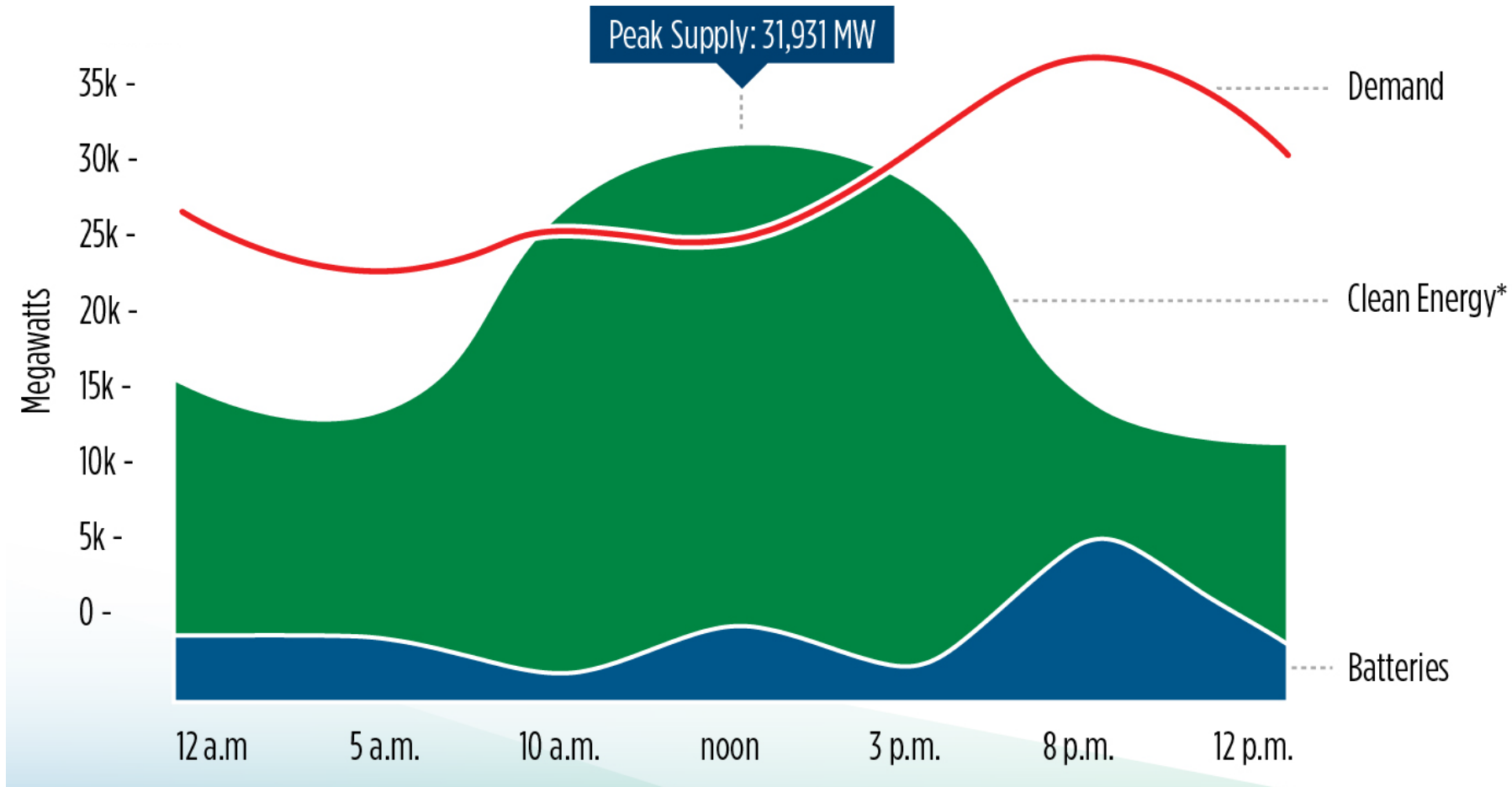
with 61% of the state's electricity already coming from renewable and zero-carbon resources

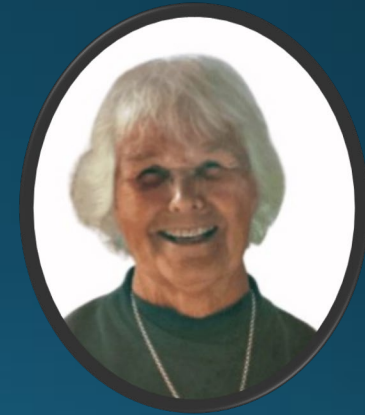
